Play

Social = Generate a healthy practice social environment that empowers the Rottweiler puppy to engage with human play that educates the puppy on a fitted behavior.

Physical = Engage in a nondestructive physical activity to exhaust the Rottweilers energy level. Illustrations involve walking, tug of war, and fetch. These guided patterns of positive activity will aid the dog to invest in a positive mental state of mind.

Mental = Unease can be a nightmare for a Rottweiler. Proper praise and encouragement can help shape the mind of the dog — flushing away negative behavior patterns that include chewing, scratching, and barking can ease back any form of melancholy the dog develops.

Emotional needs = Rottweilers require daily work. Owning a Rottweiler means a first-class commitment is required of the owner to stabilize a bond and trust with the dog. Its welfare requests this time. Once established the bond between dog and owner will continue to grow with the timeline of the dog.

Roots

The originality of the Rottweiler dog evolved out of the 1000s of years inhabitants. Bound by its black and brown trademark boasting a sturdy structure the breed was idolized for its composure. With a set mind to invade Switzerland; the Rottweiler convoyed through the Alps assisting the Roman Empire soldiers safeguarding livestock from harm. Back then however, the breed was conceptualized as a mastiff.

As a result, the Rottweilers lineage took on heavy cart pulling as a form of work in Rottweil, Germany as the Roman Empire fell into dust. Too, amid the late 1880s the breed's inhabitants embarked on a decline as the rise of the Industrial Revolution pushed aside the need for heavy cart pulling. Fast Forward a few years later and Europeans began to repopulate the breed, stabilizing the decline of its inhabitants.

American breeders began to recognize the brilliance of the breed and felt the need to cultivate a population of Rottweiler dogs as a chapter in human companionship as the 1930s were introduced. Later, as a year passed the American Kennel Club annexed the dog as a member of the Working Group.

Food

Education


Since education for the well being of the Rottweiler is vital the AKC has outlined a 16 week period of key milestones that frame the continuity of behavior stressing the liability begins with the breeder interacting on the day of birth using daily touch followed by socializing leading into the sixth week with the newborn. Without doubt, the individual Rottweiler should not be separated from its littermates prior to the seventh week in the aforementioned activities.

To that end, the Rottweiler's journey with family — if properly socialized as a puppy — cements a loyalty and commitment to its owner.






